This course covers the scientific principles behind OCT technology, both current and emerging, and the clinical indications for its use. The majority of the course consists of clinical case examples highlighting the use of OCT in patient care and management. Several conditions including macular edema, VMTS, ERM, macular hole, AMD, PED, neurosensory retinal detachment, glaucoma, NAION, ONH drusen, solar maculopathy, outer retinal tubules, and many others are covered.

This course covers systemic cancer principles and epidemiology as well as several types of ocular malignancies. 2018 Spring Congress Speakers

Dr. Josh Johnston is the clinical director and residency director for Georgia Eye Partners in Atlanta, GA. His clinical focus is on ocular surface disease, including dry eye and other corneal diseases and his background reflects extensive experience co- managing surgical patients before and after LASIK, cataract and other advanced corneal and refractive surgical procedures. He founded Oculus Consulting Partners to help practices and doctors better run dry eye clinics.

Dr. Brad Sutton is a Clinical Professor at the Indiana University School of Optometry and is the Chief of Service at the Indianapolis Eye Care Center. Dr. Sutton's main areas of clinical interest include ocular disease and surgical co-management. He has given over 350 continuing education lectures on topics related to ocular disease at the local, state, national, and international level, and has published extensively. He was named the Young OD of the year in both Tennessee and Indiana, and he has served as the President of the Optometric Retina Society.

The lecture team of **Ron Melton, OD, FAAO** and **Randall Thomas, OD, MPH, FAAO** received the "Pioneer in Optometry" recognition by the Editorial Board of Primary Care Optometry News in April 2015 for their contributions to educating optometrists around the world in ocular disease. They are co-recipients of the 2014 Vincent Ellerbrock Clinician Educator Award by the American Academy of Optometry for outstanding and sustained contributions to the Academy's Lectures and Workshops program. They have lectured nationally and internationally on ocular disease and pharmacology at over 1,000 continuing medical education meetings. Drs. Melton and Thomas have authored or co-authored over 100 papers on optometry and are the co-authors of the popular annual "Clinical Guide to Ophthalmic Drugs" for Review of Optometry. They have has acted as investigators in more than 50 clinical research trials. Both are certified as a Diplomate, American Board of Optometry. They are full-time clinicians delivering primary and secondary eye care.

Tucson VA Residents: The Southern Arizona VA Health Care System (SAVAHCS), based in Tucson, Arizona is a highly affiliated tertiary-care referral system serving veterans in Arizona, surrounding southwest States, and Mexico. The eye clinic at SAVAHCS is shared jointly between optometry and ophthalmology, which provides the residents with the opportunity to manage a spectrum of ocular disease. Additionally, SAVAHCS hosts the Southwestern Blind Rehabilitation Center, which provides world class programs for visually impaired veterans from seven western states. Low vision care is provided in both a comprehensive multidisciplinary inpatient and outpatient setting.

Dr. Loren Rodgers is an Ocular Disease/Low Vision optometry resident at the Southern Arizona Veterans Affairs Health Care System. She earned her Doctor of Optometry degree from State University of New York College of Optometry in 2017. Dr. Rodgers began her path to optometry as a Vision Science major at the University of the Incarnate Word as part of the Joint (3+4) Program. She is a native of Texas and grew up in the Hill Country surrounding San Antonio.

Dr. Ryan Martinez is currently an Ocular Disease/Low Vision optometry resident at the Southern Arizona Veterans Affairs Health Care System. He received his Doctor of Optometry degree from the Southern California College of Optometry at Marshall B. Ketchum University in 2017 and holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Biological Sciences from the University of California, Santa Barbara. Dr. Martinez is a native of California and grew up in the small town of Kingsburg in central California.

Dr. Kaitlin Vass is currently an Ocular Disease/Primary Care optometry resident at the Sierra Vista Community Based Outpatient Clinic.
